Registration and conference fee:

The conference fee is **150 Euro**. The fee will cover the participation in all sessions, dinner reception, coffee, and lunch during the conference (at the Maierdsdorf Faculty Club). Students and post-doctorates are exempt from the conference fee and invited to all receptions and meals.

In addition, the fee for Caesarea excursion will be **30 Euro** (including lunch).

At this stage you may send your title and abstract without payment of the registration fee. In a forthcoming memo we will provide instructions on how and when to pay your fees.
